Dear Members,

I think it fair to say that for many of us our Christmas break whilst celebrated with family and friends, was also a time of concern and anxiety with the bushfire season in full swing. I hope that all of our members have come through without personal loss, although I know that many of us will know of someone or have someone in our lives that have been impacted in some way. The good thing about art is that we can use these experiences to inspire ideas for our artwork with many different themes to explore.

At the end of last year the committee voted to end the lease on the Jade Yurt. We will be discussing ideas on how the space should be used, over the next few months as we wait for it to be vacated, as to how it would best service the centre and our community. So if you have any ideas that you would like us to consider please put them forward so they can be discussed. (see p.7)

It has been pleasing this year to see our print making class up and running for the first time and I believe that this has been largely due to Katherine Kennedy's commitment to making our first Print Prize last year such a success. This reinforces that the committee's hard work is paying off as we continue to reach out to our community with events that inspire people to learn and create art.

You will notice the concrete path to the toilet with much needed drainage installed is almost complete with just a few decorative touches to be added shortly. I cannot thank the two David's enough, especially working in the heat of this summer to get the work finished.

We have also had a number of discussions with Blue Mountains City Council and have clarified the responsibility of tree removal. This has been in our favour and council will be removing a few of the trees that we had identified as concerning for us. Council has been very helpful on a number of issues that we have consulted with them on of late and I am pleased that we have developed a good relationship with a number of key staff.

Council is also hoping to engage the public with its "LIVE LOCAL" campaign. This campaign is about living and buying in your local communities in an effort to help businesses that are struggling due to recent declines in activity from the bushfire season. Our very own Hare St. Gallery will be taking part in the programme with Councillor Brendan Christie due to drop off campaign signs to the gallery this weekend.

Richard Cutler held his 2020 VISION Exhibition in January and the main room was filled with colour. It was such a pleasure to see Richard's work up on the walls. This month we have Mina Turnbull exhibiting for 2020 VISION on the 15th of February; this will be Mina's first solo exhibition so please come along and support the event.

We look forward to another great year at the centre and hope that everyone is enjoying their classes and that you participate in the exhibitions whether it's your first time or you are an old hand, we welcome you all.

Enrolments went fairly smoothly this term with most classes running with good numbers. Creative Kids vouchers are being used by most children. The website is working well and most people are managing their enrolments.

We finally have a print class running with 6 participants. We also have a few print group members.

Observational Drawing has taken off with 6, and Painting with Watercolour, which moved from Friday to Thursday night has a healthy 6 participants.

Painting on Monday morning is full with 10. So altogether we have 110 students across 19 classes, which is a great start to the year!

The first quarter of 2020 started 1st February with 9 members of the cooperative. We finished the 3rd quarter with \$936 in sales. A very warm welcome back everyone. I do hope you and your families and friends have been able to come through the terrible tragedies of our catastrophic summer unscathed.

Over the break I tidied up the library cupboard in the pottery room and have gone through all our pottery books and taken out multiple copies. We intend to offer these books to any potters who have lost books in the fires by advertising on the Australian Pottery Forum – I will ask potters to email me what books they would like and I will post them out. Postal charges will be a donation from me.

Over the long hot days I have had time to update all our folders in the kiln room as they were in a dilapidated state. I checked all the computer programs and reprogrammed (when necessary) both Father Bear and Mother Bear kilns. Some of the Mother Bear Programs had been changed over time and didn't reflect what was in the old folder. I have slowed down the bisque program a little due to some complaints of cracking in larger pieces and I have added a lustre firing program. There is still space for one more program to be added in Mother Bear's computer. I have entered 4 basic programs to Father Bear so its computer has space for some more programs. Let me know what you would like added.

We now have the following folders:

Father Bear folder – contains firing fees, programs and manual

Mother Bear folder – contains firing fees, programs and manual

Mother Bear Father Bear kiln booking folder - (Remember they cannot be fired at the same time.)

Baby Bear folder – contains firing fees, instructions for firing schedules, booking sheets and its manual. Baby Bear can be fired when one of the other two kilns is on.

If you do not attend a regular group, put your firing fees in an envelope provided with name and firing details and put in the kiln fee pouch.

Please put the kilns shelves back where you got them from when you unpack. Not all shelves are the same size, so are kept in separate sections.

POTTERY FACILITATOR'S REPORT continued:

NEW MEMBERS

As a general rule our kilns are for the exclusive use of active members.

Active members: must have paid our yearly membership - \$65 /yr

must be willing to participate in our two yearly exhibitions.

Due to increases in costs we have had to increase our firing fees for 2020:

	1080/1100	1220/1280
Baby Bear	\$24	\$28
Mother Bear	\$38	\$44
Father Bear	\$76	\$88

These fees are half what you would pay to have pots fired at Blackwattle in slightly smaller kilns. The sharpest jump in fees is for Baby Bear because the fees in 2019 were under-priced to begin with.

Richard's Musings

As Chagall wrote in "My Life": "Art seems to me to be above all a state of the soul. The souls of everyone, of all bipeds at all points of the earth are holy."

And in 1958, in a speech at the University of Chicago he said: "Life is clearly a miracle. We are parts of this life and we pass, with age, from one form of life to another... a man can never technically or mechanically learn all the secrets of life. But through his soul he is connected with the world, in harmony with it, perhaps even unconsciously."



Marc Chagall, (1887— 1985)

These statements are from the Byzantine tradition of icons, so popular in Russia where Chagall came from and I believe, have relevance in my art today. Chagall also admired Gauguin for his colour which was pure, original, radiant, bearing energy and magic, not just of the South Seas but of Egypt too - "flat women on flat walls!"

Art being connected to the soul and being personal cannot be taught. But an artist can help another to save a lot of time by being a friend and helping another to be more personal, pointing out problems along their personal way and expression. Art is really learnt as in other crafts by con-naturalty, that is "living with" as children do. And, one can learn by copying the masters and minor masters, in short "Art is learnt from Art"; it is only a parallel to nature. Also, a good teacher has to be experienced in many forms of Art. Otherwise he can only teach arbitrary techniques which may be useful commercially but might tend to destroy "Art" in the individual.

"The heart has its reasons which reason does not know" (Pascal).

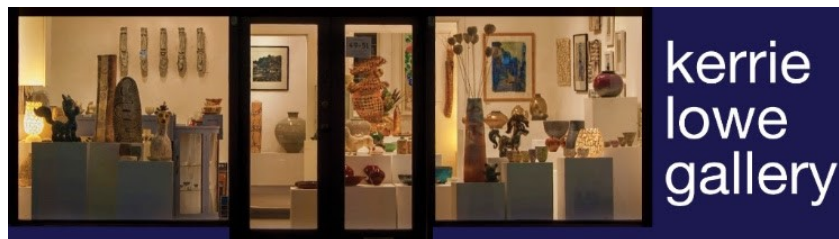

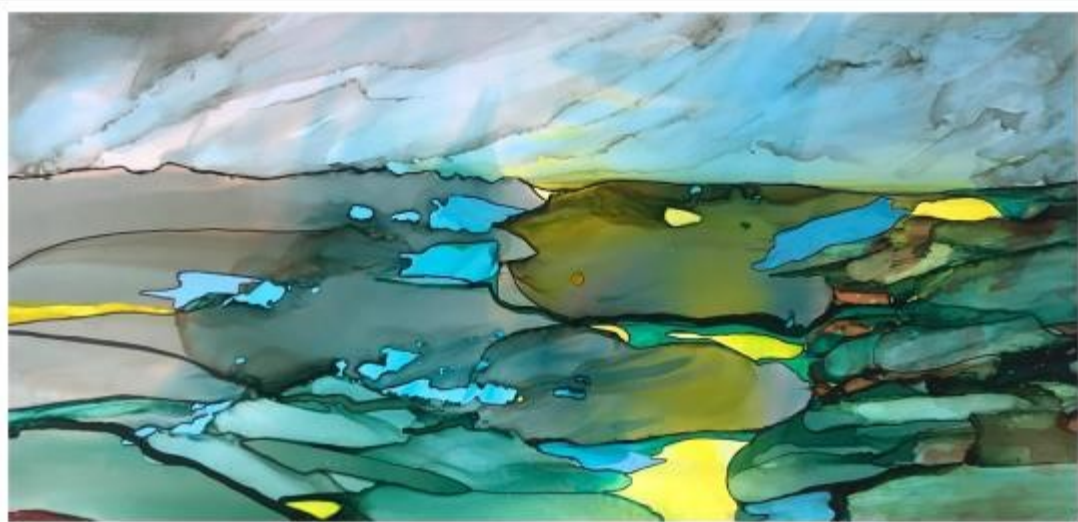
